Dear Friends,

As this year draws to a close and we look forward to the New Year, we take the opportunity to let you know of the very sad and difficult decision of our community to work toward the closure of our monastery.

During the last few years our hope for new vocations has not been realized and we are below the number of sisters required by the Holy See for a community of cloistered Nuns, enabling us to live fully our contemplative charism. In the light of these realities, after much prayer, discussion and community discernment we feel God is leading us according to His will. Thus, we look forward with joy and hope in God's Providential plan for this Diocese and for each sister.

We truly love the people of the Kamloops Diocese and this beautiful setting in the North Okanagan where our monastery is located, surrounded by mountains. We are so grateful to Bishop Joseph Nguyen for his constant kindness and deep appreciation for the witness of our silent presence in his Diocese. It is his desire and hope that this property will become the home of another religious order. We are certainly happy about that.

We owe a debt of gratitude to our previous Bishops; Emeritus Bishop David Monroe, and to Emeritus Bishop Lawrence Sabatini CS who graciously invited us to this Diocese thirty three years ago.

We hold in our hearts all those who during these past thirty three years have shown us such devotion and dedication. We are grateful to all of you our dear friends, families and benefactors, far and near who deeply value our life of prayer. Thank you for your loving prayers and generous financial support.

The Masses that have been requested will be offered here, but after December 31st, we will no longer be accepting Mass stipends. However, Mass will continue to be celebrated in our chapel as usual.

Obviously, the process of closure will take some time. We ask for your prayers and support during this difficult time of transition. We will keep you updated with further notices on our website.

Know that you will always be carried in our hearts and in our prayers.
